THE CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

A joyous Easter to all and may the blessings of the Easter Season be yours throughout the weeks ahead!

This is certainly a joyful time in the Church's life because of several reasons. First, we are concluding the Season of Lent and entering into the greatest celebration of the year - Easter and the Easter Season. Second, the Church is celebrating the election of a new pope, Francis I. The conclave at the Vatican lasted not much more than a day, and the cardinals chose a man with a humble, pastoral heart who has had years of experience in managing a large diocese throughout difficult economic and political times. Insofar as anyone can be called "ready," to take on the monumental responsibility of the papacy, Francis I seems ready.

The cardinals, I am sure, were eager to elect the new pope before Holy Week arrived, and they have succeeded. It would have been most regrettable if there were no Bishop of Rome to preside at those important liturgies which so many pilgrims attend. It is also regrettable that in our own parishes most parishioners do not attend the liturgies of Holy Thursday and Good Friday which play a critical role in the liturgical year and have a special power to inspire and instruct us. They are not "holydays of obligation," but they have an importance that goes beyond obligation.

Holy Week reaches its climax with Easter, which derives its importance, of course, from our Lord's resurrection. When Jesus was raised from the dead, he became, as St. Paul says, a life- giving spirit. Our hope for eternal life, our faith in Jesus as the Son of God, and the power of all the sacraments are found within the mystery of the Resurrection. In the risen Christ we see the goal of all creation and the beginning of the new heaven and the new earth that all the prophets and saints have hoped for and striven to achieve.

In Christ crucified and risen from the dead both sin and death were marked for defeat. The Lord now waits only for us to take advantage of the victory he has won.


